The Beyond Within: Realizing the Nearness of God

In our culture as in many others, the word 'God' usually conjures up images of a Supreme Being, someone (male) somewhere else (heaven) who may or may not – for reasons beyond our comprehension – intervene in response to our prayers. This notion of the divine no longer makes sense for a growing number of people many of whom have thrown out the baby with the bathwater; that is, they reject all belief in God. Quaker mystic Rufus Jones coined the phrase "the beyond within" in reference to God understood as a reality whose presence is omnipresent. The mystery to which the word 'God' refers is both unfathomable and knowable, "out of this world" and the essence of it.

Our retreat will offer the opportunity to reflect on our experiences/images/concepts/beliefs about God and to share them with others who are seeking a meaningful way to relate to their Higher/Inner Power.

#### Excerpt from Honest to God by Bishop John A. T. Robinson

The traditional formulation of Christianity, he (Paul Tillich) says, has been in terms of what he calls 'supranaturalism'. According to this way of thinking, which is what we have all been brought up to, God is posited as 'the highest Being' – out there, above and beyond this world, existing in his own right alongside and over against his creation...

Here God is the supreme Being, the grand Architect, who exists somewhere out beyond the world – like a rich aunt in Australia – who started it all going, periodically intervenes in its running, and generally gives evidence of his benevolent interest in it.

It is a simple matter to shoot down this caricature and to say that what we believe in is not Deism but Theism, and that God's relationship to the world is fully and intimately personal, not this remote watchmaker relationship described by Deists. But it is easy to modify the quality of

this relationship and to leave the basic structure of it unchanged, so that we continue to picture God as a Person, who looks down at this world which he has made and loves from 'out there'...

It is precisely the identification of Christianity – and transcendence – with this conception of theism that I believe we must be prepared to question... I am convinced that Tillich is right in saying that 'the protest of atheism against such a highest person is correct'... What is important is whether such a Being represents even a distorted image of the Christian God. Can he be rehabilitated, or is the whole conception of that sort of God, 'up there', 'out there', or however one likes to put it, a projection, an idol, that can and should be torn down?

## **BOOKS FOR THE JOURNEY**

Honest to God by Bishop John A.T. Robinson (Westminster Press)

"ALL I CAN DO IS TO TRY TO BE HONEST... Honest to God and honest about God." So writes the author of this highly controversial book. Bishop Robinson speaks not only for himself but for all those who find their integrity strained by the conventional thought patterns of the church. He believes the church in our time is now being called to nothing less than a revolution that will question many of the basic assumptions which Christians have held in the past. The book is frankly disturbing – but it will make you think.

The God We Never Knew by Marcus Borg (HarperSanFrancisco)

How to have faith — even to think about God — without having to stifle modern rational thought is one of the most vital challenges facing many of us today. Marcus Borg traces his personal spiritual journey to the discovery of an authentic yet fully contemporary understanding of God. In a compelling, readable way, he leads us from the distant, authoritarian God of our childhood to an equally powerful, dynamic adult image of God, the life spirit that is within us and all around us that reconciles faith with science, history, critical thinking, and religious pluralism.

God: a Brief History by Paul E. Captetz (Fortress Press)

THIS BRIEF TOUR THROUGH THREE THOUSAND YEARS of religious history shows how the Christian doctrine of God evolved in response to tensions within the insights of monotheism. The very personal, changeable, and involved God of the Hebrew Bible transformed decisively in its encounter with Greek metaphysical concepts and with the emerging trinitarian notions of the early Christian period. Captetz skillfully traces this history and shows how the tensions thus created are still with us.
