

Small Victories by Anne Lamott (Riverhead Press)

In this book, Lamott offers a new message of hope that celebrates the triumph of light over the darkness in our lives. Our victories over hardship and pain may seem small but they change us – our perceptions, our perspectives, and our lives. Lamott writes of forgiveness, restoration, and transformation, how we can turn toward love even in the most hopeless situations, how we can find joy in getting lost and our amazement in finally being found.

Dissolving the Ego, Realizing the Self by David Hawkins (Hay House)

How does one traverse the spiritual landscape to move beyond suffering to experience the peace and love of God, to dissolve illusion and realize the state of enlightenment? In this collection of inspiring passages, the reader is reminded of the illusory nature of the personal self, and the direct pathways to dissolve the ego and it's trappings.

Song of the Bird by Anthony DeMello (Image Books)

This book consists of 124 stories/parables from a variety of traditions, both ancient and modern. Each story is really a single lesson of life that teaches inescapable truths about ourselves and our world. The *Song of the Bird* uses stories to illustrate profound realities that put us in touch with the problems and concerns of everyday life as well as our common spiritual quest.


HOLOCAUST COMMEMORATION
