

## Thoughts on Spirituality and Peace



Spirituality is often thought to be primarily an internal matter concerning the tranquil realization of the sacredness of the self, and the practice - often solitary - of meditation and other disciplines whose aim is to foster awareness of, and growth in the spirit.

The reality is that this understanding is only half of the truth. Spirituality is an internal matter that is about discovering who we are (spiritual beings), but it also has to do with how we are (our relationships to others and to the world in general). Many people pursue spiritual growth in order to attain a sense of inner-peace, hoping to find refuge from the chaos of their lives, and from the world's madness. But developing spiritually does not protect us from life's difficulties; rather, it enables us to engage them.

If we are fortunate enough to become peaceful through our pursuit of spiritual growth, we may also find that we are compelled to address the chaos around us. This is so because spiritual maturity brings us to the realization that we are one with everyone at the deepest level of our being. This awareness makes it difficult to turn away from the reality of injustice, and from those who are victims of it. If the peacefulness within us is the fruit of a spiritual presence, and not merely the effect of slowing down and finding a remedy for stress, we will also sense a restlessness that can only be stilled when we address the worlds' unrest. The words of Rabbi Hillel, a contemporary of Jesus, come to mind: "If I do not care for myself, who will care for me. If I care for myself alone, who am I?"
