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We find out who we are not by consulting others or by looking into the mirror, but by going to... the center of our soul. According to Annie Dillard, what we discover in the stillness and quiet of our deepest selves is that "our lives are a faint tracing on the surface of mystery." What an awakening it is to realize that who we thought we were was merely the tip of the iceberg, and that what lies beneath the surface is not only vast, but also divine. A word for this truth is 'mysticism.'

When we are able to open our minds and hearts to our mystical nature then, like the sun breaking through a cloudy sky, the world is bathed in a new light. We can then see the unity that lies beneath diversity, the common bond that unites us to all people, and to the earth that sustains us.

From the Tao of Psychology

When the ego is cut off from experiencing the Self - or, put differently, when an individual lacks the inner sense of being connected to God or being part of the Tao - then a wound exists that the person experiences as gnawing, pervasive, persisting insecurity. All kinds of defensive maneuvers from smoking to amassing power, are unsatisfying efforts to feel better. The narcissism of modern times seems fueled by the feeling of being deprived and unnourished emotionally or spiritually, which is part of the same wound. A person thus wounded seeks novelty, excitement, power, or prestige to compensate for a lack of joy or inner peace. Chronic anger and depression seem to hide just below the surface of the persona, or face presented to the world... Emotionally, scarcity rather than abundance prevails, and thus generosity, compassion, giving hope and helping all are constricted, and joy and growth are stifled.
