BOOKS FOR THE JOURNEY

The Losses of Our Lives: The Sacred Gifts of Renewal in Everyday Loss by *Dr. Nancy Copeland-Payton* (Skylight Paths Publishing)

Based on her experience as a physician, hospital chaplain, and pastor, Dr Copeland-Payton invites us to awaken to the losses of our lives – big and small – and embrace the wisdom each has to teach us about the deep mystery of God and the nature of living. Written for those experiencing loss and those accompanying them, this book encourages us to venture deeper into our losses through practical exercises drawn from the world's major faith traditions.

When Bad Things Happen to Good People by *Harold Kushner* (Bobbs-Merrill)

A conservative rabbi, Kushner addresses in the book one of the principle problems of theodicy, the conundrum why, if the universe was created and is governed by a God who is of a good and loving nature, there is nonetheless so much suffering and pain in it. The book is dedicated to the memory of his young son, Aaron, who died at the age of 14 of the incurable genetic disease progeria.

The Way of the Peaceful Warrior by *Dan Millman* (New World Press)

This is a part-fictional, part-autobiographical book based on the early life of the author. It tells of a chance meeting with a gas station attendant who becomes a spiritual teacher to the young gymnast. The attendant, whom Millman names Socrates, becomes a kind of father figure and teaches Millman how to become a “peaceful warrior.”

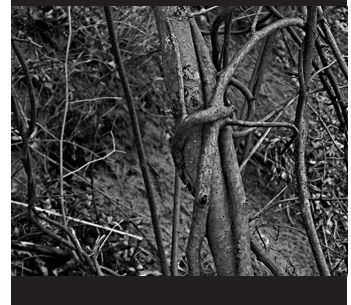
